# HORNSBY SHIRE COUNCIL ADOPTS WESTLEIGH PARK MASTERPLAN AND PLAN OF MANAGEMENT



Following extensive community and stakeholder engagement, Hornsby Shire Council last night formally adopted a revised draft Master Plan and the draft Plan of Management for its Westleigh Park project, a major new parkland to be developed in Westleigh.

Formerly owned by Sydney Water, the site for the new Westleigh Park comprises around 36 hectares of cleared open space and bushland. The redevelopment will create a major parkland with spaces for play and sporting activities, and a choice of 'unstructured recreation experiences' including mountain biking, walking and cycling, while conserving important bushland areas.

The draft Master Plan was first exhibited in 2021. Following additional engagement, Council endorsed a revised draft Master Plan for the site and a draft Plan of Management. These were exhibited through March and April 2023 and a significant number of

submissions were received, demonstrating strong community interest in the park.

Hornsby Shire Mayor, Philip Ruddock AO said that this outcome was a major step forward in advancing Council's vision for Westleigh Park.

"We are pleased to take this significant step forward with the Westleigh Park project. After years of careful consideration, the adopted Master Plan and Plan of Management detail how we will provide an outstanding recreational experience for the community at Westleigh while ensuring the long-term protection of the previous bushland," said Mayor Ruddock.

"We have worked hard to engage extensively with the community and thank everyone who has contributed. All the community's views are important to us, and this Master Plan and Plan of Management will now support the preparation of a Development Application (DA) on the site which will be assessed by an independent body," Mayor Ruddock said.

Council will continue to prepare the DA for Westleigh Park; it is anticipated it will be lodged by the end of 2023. To view the adopted Master Plan and Plan of Management visit hornsby. nsw.gov.au/westleighpark.

# NEW EV CHARGING STATION IN BEECROFT

Hornsby Shire Council is proud to announce the unveiling of a state-of-the-art public electric vehicle (EV) charging station in the Beecroft Village car park.

Hornsby Mayor Philip Ruddock said "This new charging station here at Beecroft provides our residents with greater access to charging networks in our local area." There are currently 879 EV owners in Hornsby Shire.


The charge station was installed by JOLT Charge, on the Ausgrid substation kiosk at the location. JOLT Charge is powered by 100% certified GreenPower energy and provides EV drivers with free, fast charging. Australian EV users are eligible for up to 7kWh for free across the JOLT network each day, providing 50kms of driving range.

This new JOLT addition sees three fast chargers now available in the Hornsby Local Government Area, with further charging sites planned to be introduced as the interest in EV grows.

Council adopted an Electric Vehicle Charging Stations on Public Land Policy in April 2020 to improve EV charging infrastructure and support the community in reduction of carbon emissions. For more information, visit hornsby.nsw.gov.au/environment/sustainability/electric-vehicles.

# WHY IS HEARING IN NOISE SO DIFFICULT?

When we gather with friends and family around the dinner table, at a BBQ or at the local pub for a meal and a catch-up. In those situations, many people experience they have difficulties following the conversation as everything seems to get 'muddled up'. Why is this and what can be done?

If one struggles to hear and understand in social settings it bears the risk of 'tuning out' and social withdrawal may be a result. It is difficult for most people to communicate in situations with lots of surrounding noise.

The problem has multiple reasons. Human speech consists of many parts. Some parts like letters such as "M, N, L, A, O" are low in frequency but high in intensity so they carry well and have lots of power. These parts of the speech transfer volume from a speaker to a listener and they do that very well as they have plenty of energy. Other parts of speech like sounds such as "TH, S, C, F, SH," are essentially only pressed air through the teeth and tongue. These unvoiced sounds are very high in frequency and extremely low in energy. The purpose of those sounds is to transfer speech clarity and help to distinguish one word from another. Often the smallest part of a word makes all the difference. For example, "Faith" and "Face" - the difference between 'th'

and 'ce' is very small. In most cases our eyes 'hear' these sounds better by lip-reading than the ears really hear them. A major problem with these highly important part of speech is that they can be masked and literally squashed by louder sounds.

In social settings the "cocktail-party-effect" makes the noise level increase quickly. There is a little bit of music, that makes it harder to hear – so everyone starts speaking louder and as we 'shout' the energy of A, E, M, N, O etc. gets so high that they overpower the important sounds for clarity. So, in a situation with many people talking everything sounds really muffled and it's difficult to make out the words the other person is saying. Additionally, most age or noise related hearing losses start in the higher frequency only adding to those issues.

Some people with even a mild hearing loss choose not to go to functions and meetings anymore as they cannot participate in



conversations. It is very tiring for the brain to constantly strain to try hearing what is being said and the choice to withdraw is quickly made.

But it does not have to be this way. There is help available! We want our community to hear well and have fun when they are in company and not feel lonely and isolated.





The school also has a Return and Earn collection cage, composting bins, paper and cardboard recycling, and a co-mingled recycling bin.



# RISING ELECTRICITY PRICES ARE HURTING LOCAL SMALL BUSINESSES

As I visit local residents and businesses across the electorate, I am consistently hearing about the cost of living. I am especially concerned about how rising electricity prices are impacting local small businesses.

I recently visited Anthony's Gourmet Meats in Round Corner. The owner, Tony, told me his business incurs a very high quarterly electricity bill, which is now consistently rising. Tony is doing what he can to reduce his energy usage, but he must consistently run air conditioning, freezers, and a cool room so that the meat he sells remains safe.

I also visited Popolate, a bakery in Hornsby Heights. Popolate is one of my favourite places in the electorate to pick up a cupcake. The owner, Su, told me that almost all of their costs have been increasing, with some costs doubling over just the last few months. Every time that electricity costs rise, the burden on local businesses becomes that much greater. The Government's failure to bring down electricity prices negatively impacts every household and every business in our electorate.

I am deeply troubled about this issue, because I know that businesses in our area are doing their best to reduce their energy usage.

The feedback I have heard from Tony and Su is very similar to the feedback I have heard recently from a range of other small business owners in the area.

Small businesses are coming to the table by doing everything they can to reduce their energy usage. But every time our local businesses find a way to make a saving, prices rise again.

It is time that the Government also acts. They must do more so that energy prices begin to fall and local businesses get some of the relief that they need.



# **RURAL ROUNDUP**

**CLR WARREN WADDELL** 

During the June meeting, Hornsby Shire Council resolved to progress several items for

adoption or further investigation that relate to the rural area.

The State initiated land use amendments, designed to encourage and support Agritourism and associated activities linked to original rural uses. These changes support the viability of many of our rural enterprises.

The Heritage Interpretation and Action plan also mentioned the potential for our village precincts to celebrate and promote through interpretation, the district's close connection to historical fruit production. Reflecting on the origins of the district's farms could contribute positively to future economic development and tourism strategies.

As part of Council's ongoing review of its asset base and asset performance, a feasibility study of our Galston Johnson Rd Council depot

and former pony club site, has been conducted. The study suggested that despite being heavily encumbered with significant bushland, the RFS facility and a power easement, a financially sustainable outcome could be achieved from approx. 30 per cent of the site.

The inclusion of the RFS facility in the assessment of the site, also highlighted the opportunity to access the site directly off Mid Dural Rd.

Although, only a feasibility study at this stage and with a couple of years of planning ahead, it is encouraging that the established bushland would remain and serve as a natural interface between neighbouring residential.

I look forward to working with the community in ensuring the best and most balanced outcome. In particular, conveying what additional recreational features may be factored into a future detailed design.

# **SILKY NEEDLE BUSH**

**BY LACHLAN TURNER** 

When venturing along walking tracks in our local bushland it is always a pleasant surprise to come across an unexpected wildflower. One of the more noticeable and abundant varieties during cooler months would be the Silky Needle Bush (Hakea sericea).

This attractive spreading, open shrub may grow up to 3m high in favourable conditions. It can be found in both open forest and scrubby heathlands which have sandy or clay soils.

Depending upon its habitat, flowering may commence in June and continue into September.

The narrow, fairly rigid leaves are about 50mm long, right angled to the branch, having a sharp tip at the end. Hence the word "Needle" in its name. The other word in its common name appears to be derived from the silky hairs that are present on new growth.

Delicately formed white flowers are mostly clustered towards the ends of reddish brown branches. These flowers possess a mild scent that can be detected if you are able to get close enough to them without coming in contact with the sharp spiky leaves while doing so.

The fruits of this shrub develop into a rounded and wrinkled, woody hard shell reminiscent of a walnut shell. The matured fruit may remain on the plant for several years before it opens to reveal a flat, winged seed.

As with many species of our native flora there are frequently similar varieties. In the case of this one, a close relative is known as the Warty Needle Bush (Hakea propinqua) which may be mistaken for the Silky Needle Bush.

It is possible to propagate both these varieties for use in a native home garden.

Our special guest speaker will be one of our younger talented members Harold Kuan. Harold joined BSA, 3 years ago after discovering his passion for the Tillandsia online.

Finding that his Tillandsias needed a stand for showing purposes he pushed himself to make the wire stands his entries required for display in Bromeliad competitions.

With no previous training in metal work, he just figured out how to make them as he went along. Harold obtains the mesh from Bunnings, which he cuts with bolt cutters and then bends. For wood

mounts he finds branches and large pieces on walks around his neighbourhood but purchases cork from an orchid supplier.

Currently he estimates Tillandsias make up 80% of his collection, but he also likes Billbergias, Dykias, Neoregelias, Aechmeas – really any bromeliad with colour, sculpture or unusual form.

Harold will give a hands on demonstration during his presentation at the meeting on "how to mount Tillandsia."

Guests are most welcome to come along to Harold's presentation. There will also be our regular meeting activities such as competitions, Raffle, Show & Tell, and a more recent activity called just "Show" for people who would just like to share a plant with others without it being critically judged or discussed.
