Dr Michelle Byrne said: "Events like the Biviano's Gala Ball are vital not only in terms of raising funds for important mental health programs such as the ones run by Positive Vibes but also in terms of ensuring we continue

to have important conversations in the community around positive mental health and well being.

"The funds raised from the evening will go towards the running of our programs including the Hills Women's Shed, Paws Visits, community engagement and the Healthy Minds Youth Forum as well as towards the expansion of the Women's Shed to provide more opportunities for local women to join the Women's Shed.

"We are also looking to expand Positive Vibes Foundation's line up of programs to also include a focus on veterans."

Owner Biviano's Raj Kumar said he and staff appreciated the community's support of what will be an "excellent night, communicating, and having lots of fun" at the same time.

# PROPERTY & YOU - BY PAUL MCKENZIE, ABS CONVEYANCING FIRST HOME BUYERS - NEW STAMP DUTY RATES & RULES

As from the 1st July 2023, the new NSW State Government has changed the First Home Buyers stamp duty rates and rules. The new rates, there is a full stamp exemption for First Home Buyers for sale prices up to \$800,000 and a partial exemption for sale prices up to \$1 Million.

The partial exemption concession of stamp duty guide for First Home Buyers, between \$8000,00 and \$1 Million is as follows (Source: Revenue NSW).

The rules for First Home Buyers on stamp duty exemptions and concessions also have changed. You must live in the property, soon after settlement for at least 12 months. Revenue NSW are strict, in the terms and conditions for First Home Buyers stamp duty exemptions and concessions. Serious consequences and ramifications, if not complying and breaching the rules.

# **RUDDOCK PARK UPGRADES ON 48TH BIRTHDAY**

A day after the 48th anniversary of when Ruddock Park, Westleigh was opened in honour of former Shire President, the Hon Max Ruddock, an impressive suite of upgrades was yesterday officially unveiled by his son, Hornsby Shire Mayor, the Hon Philip Ruddock AO.

Funded by the NSW Government through the Public Spaces Legacy Program in association Hornsby Shire Council, the upgrades include a new Learn-To-Ride play area, pathway upgrades, a basketball half court, new five-way swing, new seating and picnic shelters, planting, lawn areas and an outdoor gym, and refurbishments to Westleigh Tennis Club.



Ruddock Park was opened on 28 June 1975 as a tribute to Max Ruddock's role in the establishment of Westleigh and in recognition of his work as a councillor and former president of Hornsby Shire Council. Thousands of people flock to the park each year for its well-equipped, boat themed playground, large oval, mature, shady trees and picnic areas. "Ruddock Park is of great significance to myself and my family. It is a tangible commemoration of the significant contribution that my father made to Westleigh and Hornsby Shire as a whole. It is particularly dear to me as, not only does it bring back fond memories of him, but it's also somewhere I visited with my own children when they were young.

"I'm incredibly proud and excited to officially launch these upgrades, just in time for the school holidays. They raise the bar for what people can enjoy at the park, give it longevity and are a significant boost for the local area.

# NEW SPORTS COMPLEX IS UNDERWAY IN NORTH KELLYVILLE

The Hills Shire Council is celebrating the first major construction milestone at a soon-to-be-built sports complex in North Kellyville.

Machinery is now on-site at Stringer Road Reserve and carrying out bulk earthworks that will soon transform the vacant space into a thriving place where residents and visitors can play team sports, enjoy recreational activities, socialise and stay active and healthy.

Mayor of The Hills Shire, Dr Peter Gangemi said he was proud to see work commencing on the new complex, which is anticipated to open in the second half of 2024 (weather permitting).

"This facility will not only cater to the growing community but will also support grassroots sports and promote active and healthy lifestyles," Mayor Gangemi said.

"It will benefit local residents and teams in the short term and have long-lasting effects on the community for years to come. It also has the potential to produce future champions, including Olympians and Paralympians.

"I look forward to seeing this facility taking shape over the next few months and then being utilised when it opens to the community in 2024," he said.



Once complete, the sports complex will include four multi-purpose natural turf fields that can be reconfigured into two ovals. There's also an amenities building with accessible toilets, change rooms, a kiosk, a referee room and storage.

# ADVERTORIAL WHY IS MY PRINTER USING SO MUCH INK OR TONER


Does it seem like you are constantly having to buy ink (or toner) for your printer? This can be very stressful as you feel you are being ripped off.

1. Small capacity cartridges in an old printer: Older style printers could only print a few hundred pages at most due to the cartridge capacity. Modern printers now have much larger capacity cartridges (for almost the same price!!) due to customer demand.



- **2.** Quality of your print: For your normal day to day printing you may have the quality setting too high. Look for Draft or lower the Dots Per Inch (DPI) setting. A higher quality setting will use more product.
- **3.** Using Colour needlessly: Did you know that when selecting Black & White you are still using colour? Try to find Greyscale, Greyscale will only use black ink.
- **4.** What you are printing has a huge effect: If you are printing images or photo's then you will be tearing through ink or toner. Consider getting your photo's printed at one of the big chains like Harvey Norman or The Good Guys. Also, the amount of text you are putting on a page is a big factor as I said previously.

It's really important to understand how "yield" is calculated. Every printer company benchmarks their products against an industry standard of 5% product deposition on an A4 sheet of paper. To put that in perspective, all the text in this blog would be about 7%. It's not a lot of printing. But then again, look at a new car at the dealer, the manufacturer reckons you will go 100 klicks on a litre of petrol too!

# **MILD BUT NOT INSIGNIFICANT HEARING LOSS**

Did you know that mild hearing losses are the most prevalent type of hearing loss in the world? While some people report no problems when they have a mild or minimal hearing loss, for others, it can cause difficulties when listening in day-to-day situations. These people often experience greater perceived lifestyle limitations, reduced emotional well-being and decreased sense of independence.



Minimal hearing loss is defined as a hearing loss that is just outside of the normal range

of hearing, or a hearing loss in one ear or one that is only at the high frequencies or pitches. The terms 'minimal' and 'mild' can lead to confusion because it can imply that they do not have large or negative impacts or consequences. Research has identified though, that any degree of hearing loss can adversely affect people's lives; by impacting on social, cognitive, and educational factors. Untreated hearing loss is further considered a risk factor for brain atrophy and cognitive decline.

The most noticeable impact of a minimal hearing loss is the increase in listening effort which means that more attention is required to follow conversation. When someone is recognised to have a mild or minimal hearing loss, it is likely they will receive little or no intervention. However, it is important if any type or degree of hearing loss is having an emotional or social effect on an individual, this should be addressed. It is our job as professionals to

understand the impact on the individual and ensure we provide the best care regardless of how small the problem may seem on paper.

People with minimal hearing losses may benefit from using hearing aids, or they may not. This outcome will not be known without trialling devices. Additionally, other management options such as assistive listening devices, auditory training and communication strategies could reduce listening fatigue and increase hearing enjoyment for the individual.

Hearing is one of our most important abilities and directly impacts the quality of our lives. A person with mild hearing loss may

hear well in quiet situations. While in other situations, they are not hearing as well and struggle to understand another person talking. People may attribute this problem to the situation and not to their own hearing. It can be years later before the individual discovers that it is their hearing that is responsible for the loss of clarity and not the situation only. It is important that as soon as hearing problems like these are noticed, a hearing test is completed. # HI-TECH AGRICULTURE AT PACIFIC HILLS

Pacific Hills Christian School at Dural has installed a state of the art computerised agricultural science research station called the iFarm. This is part of the School's expansion of its Agriculture program.



The Australian designed and manufactured unit has one aim in mind: helping students to understand the resources required to produce food and fibre, and stimulating their interest in agri-related careers.

iFarm features growing beds with subsurface drip irrigation and overhead watering spray systems, a 2000 litre water tank, moisture and temperature sensors, a weather station, composting worm farm and a digital touchscreen to monitor scientific data. Students will engage in planting different types of crops and monitor variables such as water, fertiliser and plant growth. They will be able to conduct comparative trials to determine best practice methods.

Not only will students learn environmentally friendly farming practices, the iFarm itself has a low carbon footprint. The outer skin is made from recycled plastic and the unit is powered by its own solar and wind energy systems.

The iFarm project is supported by funding from the Australian Government Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry as part of the Educating Kids About Agriculture: iFarm program.

The July meeting of Council began with the tabling of a community petition relating to the former pony club site in Johnson Rd Galston. The petition is a strong early indication of how many in the community would like to see this operational land utilised long term.

Through emails, the petition, and two meetings supported by ratepayer associations, GARA and AGRA, many stories and messages have been received highlighting how this parcel of land has been informally facilitating a range of recreational uses. In particular, the process has highlighted the absence of park facilities at that end of Galston Village.

Part of the combined amenity in Johnson Rd is the RFS shed. The AGRA meeting also provided an opportunity for our local RFS branch to share their aspirations for a new shed and how it could better integrate into the site.

Council also resolved to progress the latest stage of the Rural Land Study that had been prepared. The RLS sets the strategic direction for managing rural lands into the future. The latest component will put land use provisions in place that protect what we enjoy about our rural amenity while ensuring innovation and a sustainable local economy.

On another note, it was a privilege to be invited to the Greater Hills Rotary changeover dinner and celebration of volunteers. Most of us are aware of the Rotary bookfair at Galston community centre. Well, this year proved to be another huge success with proceeds being distributed to several worthy causes, including the local women's shelter.

## A BIG WIN FOR PICK-YOUR-OWN FARMS

The NSW Premier, Chris Minns, has announced his intention to scrap proposed restrictions on the number of people allowed to visit NSW farms at any one time. This announcement comes after a community campaign opposing the changes.

Under the proposed changes, the number of visitors to farm gate shops would have been capped to 100 at any one time. The number of visitors who could attend a farm experience - such as a wedding - would have been capped at 50. Farms would need special development approval to exceed those limits.

The local area is home to several long-running and highly popular pick-yourown fruit farms. Those farms include Watkins Family Farm and Fords Farm in Laughtondale, Canoelands Orchard in to the guests and spoke about our great electorate. It was wonderful to be able to share this exciting event with some of the Castle Hill constituents as well as political leaders from all levels of government.

Along with opening the office, I gave Mark Speakman a tour of some of our electorate, starting with a visit and a meet and greet at the Hills Men's Shed, who hosted a lovely morning tea. We were able to speak with the Shedders and see the amazing work of this community group in our electorate.

The final stop for the day was a meet and greet event hosted by the Sydney Hills Business Chamber. It was good to meet with these people from a wide and diverse range of businesses, to form connections, and offer an ear to small and local businesses.

Nicky Alexander has been opening Ford's Farm to visitors for 21 years.

"We're grateful that the State government is listening to the concerns that farm owners have raised, so that our businesses can remain viable and visitors can continue to enjoy the experience." Ms Alexander said.

Just a few kilometres further along the Hawkesbury River, the Watkins family have operated Watkins Family Farm since 1867. Mark Watkins is the 7th generation of his family to farm their land.

Mr Watkins said "We're still waiting for a further meeting to discuss how these restrictions will be wound back. It's crucial that these restrictions are lifted."

The overwhelming feedback from these pick-your-own farmers was that this policy would have made their family businesses financially unviable, and left the fruit to rot on trees rather than being picked by visitors.

Julian Leeser MP, Federal Member for Berowra, strongly opposed the proposed changes.

"I will always fight for my constituents against unfair regulations." Mr Leeser said.



"I want our kids in Sydney to know that fruit and vegies come from farms and not the supermarket. We should be encouraging these farms rather than weighing them down with unwanted and unneeded red-tape."

"If you haven't already done so recently, I would encourage you to visit Watkins Family Farm, Fords Farm, Canoelands Orchard, or any other local pick-your-own farms."

# Well, what a difference in weather a year makes!

This time last year the Hawkesbury was experiencing a significant flood. Whilst things have begun to return to some normality, we need to ask those impacted 'R U OK?' Mental health is very important, and it is our responsibility as a community to look after one another. I am pleased that works to River Rd have commenced. River Rd was significantly damaged in the multiple floods over the past few years, with parts of the road collapsing into the river. There is plenty of work to do here and council staff, engineers, consultants and now roadwork teams have been working hard to get these issues fixed. Please be patient whilst these works are undertaken.

Council has recently completed the missing section of Janpieter Road along the frontage of Horseworld Equestrian Stadium linking Gables to Maraylya. An important link for those living in and travelling through this area.

Brindle Parkway Reserve in Box Hill is well underway. Works currently being undertaken include; Bulk earthworks, Importation of soil, Stormwater and waste water work, Preliminary carpark work, Amenities building construction, Waterway channelling work, Sportsfield electrical work.

The Hills is a special place, some would say the best place in Sydney to live. The Hawkesbury River, the bushland, our topography and of course our sense of community make it the place it is. Enjoying our natural wonders is important. Council has recently installed a picnic shelter at Hawkins Lookout! A great place to have a picnic at what is the best view in The Hills! Now is the time to start thinking about bushfire preparedness for your property. Have you got a Bushfire Survival Plan? A well prepared home is more likely to survive a bush fire. Even if your plan is to leave early, the more you prepare your home, the more likely it will survive a bush fire or ember attack. A well prepared home can also be easier for you or firefighters to defend, and is less likely to put your neighbours' homes at risk. # Hidden in the Hills ROCK FORMATIONS

## **BY LACHLAN TURNER**

As you descend into bushland valleys along the many walking tracks in the Hills region, the presence of large rock formations becomes guite obvious.

Grey weathered sandstone bluffs are interspersed with wind eroded hollows resembling small caves.

Water too has a defining influence on the sculpturing of these rocky overhangs.

The continual breaking down of the sandstone provides much of the nutrients required by so many of the wildflowers and other plants growing in this special environment.






Sandstone ridges and slopes retain rainwater and slowly release moisture through the surrounding soils which in turn helps to nourish vegetation in the vicinity.

There are many plants, such as orchids, ferns and mosses, whose roots can actually grow on the surface of the rocks, taking advantage of small cracks in which to secure a foothold. Other plants depend on the close proximity of these rocky habitats taking advantage of the rock's protection in which to flourish.

The ability of large rocky formations to create a protected and cool environment enables moisture loving plants such as fungi and ground covers the opportunity to flourish in leaf litter beyond the reaches of the sometimes hot sunshine.

On occasions when walking through such rocky places it is possible to be confronted with rock formations that can take on some form of recognisable shape, which could, without too much imagination, be likened to some living or imaginary creature. Several examples accompany this month's column.

Next time if you are out walking along tracks bordered by large rocky outcrops, test your skill by trying to identify one of these rocky features. If you are not sure, move to another position and view your find from a different direction.
