

## DO YOU REALLY NEED A HEARING AID?

In cases of hearing loss, the most common treatment a hearing care professional will offer is a hearing aid, as they help to maximise the hearing a person has left. Hearing aids work on enhancing sounds a person may no longer hear naturally, making it easier to hear important sounds for communication and environmental awareness.

If you or a loved one is recommended a hearing aid, a very natural question is, "do I really need a hearing aid?" However, considering it takes the average person seven to ten years to act upon their hearing loss, it's obvious that many of us feel less certain about an answer.

Another important question is, "what do I risk by not acting now to improve my hearing?" Consider the consequences of NOT choosing to get an aid – the latest research shows there are significant consequences both in the medium to long-term for those who decide to delay intervention.

### THOSE WITH HEARING LOSS:

 who don't wear hearing aids are 50 per cent more likely to develop mild cognitive impairment, a precursor to dementia, than those with hearing loss who wear hearing aids;

- who opt to not be fitted with hearing aids need to exhaust additional cognitive resources (ie. brain power) engaging in challenging social situations, resulting in additional exhaustion and mental fatigue when with company;
- who don't wear hearing aids are at greater risk of social isolation, loneliness and depression;
- without hearing aids are more likely to live sedentary lives with less physical activity.

#### MEANINGFUL CONNECTIVITY

Modern hearing aids provide a number of technological benefits. They can be directly connected to media and phone sources of sound via Bluetooth technology in a similar way to earphone products, and can also access special accessibility settings of the phone, allowing for an enhanced phone or media experience, and greater connectedness to social and other entertainment activities.

Choosing to adopt hearing aids earlier saves the need for investing in other methods of hearing augmentation, such as TV entertainment system upgrades, earphones/headphones or assistive listening apps.

In adopting a hearing aid, there is a lot to gain from acting quickly, and a lot to lose if the decision is delayed. Watch out for the early warning signs that should



prompt you to act: Voices are audible but not clear – people tend to sound like they are mumbling.

Situations with background noise are becoming increasingly more difficult. You find yourself asking friends and family to repeat themselves often. Your TV, car radio or phone are turned up loud.







## YEAR 10 NATIONAL STEM CHALLENGE CHAMPIONS SHINE BRIGHT

The Science and Engineering Challenge is a nationwide STEM program presented by the University of Newcastle every year providing Year 9 and 10 students with unique science and engineering experiences beyond the classroom setting.

The National Championship assembles the best of the best, with the top eight schools from across Australia, each sending 32 students (256 in total). These eight teams have earned their place in this prestigious one-day National Final.

This year, the Pacific Hills Christian School Year 10 students were crowned the 2023 Science and Engineering Challenge champions.



A team of 31 Year 10 Pacific Hills students participated. They were divided into eight teams. It was game on as our students competed in the eight exhilarating challenges, going head-to-head against the other seven schools. Some of their challenges included building a bridge that could withstand eight kilograms of weight, constructing an eco-friendly house to collect maximum water supply and capable of withstanding an earthquake and typhoon, providing electricity to a city, communications through coding and other challenges. Across the day, students undertook eight STEM challenges.

Adapting to the unexpected, each of the eight Pacific Hills Christian School teams were formed randomly requiring our students to work as entirely new teams whilst undertaking the challenges that were also randomly assigned. This tested their capacity to adapt to unpredictable circumstances, persevere and work as unified teams to cross the line as number one. "The teamwork of our students was excellent, and their innovative ideas to solve problems was inspirational. They showed resilience, perseverance and they fought hard in every challenge", said Dr Quee, Science Research Coordinator at Pacific Hills. "Students were determined to positively spur each other on to claim first place."

We celebrate the bright minds and God-given talent of our Year 10 STEM team. This accomplishment was remarkable and demonstrates their dedication, resilience, and commitment to excellence.



# FUTURE PROOFING CHERRYBROOK COMMUNITY CENTRE

Twenty-six years ago, I visited the Cherrybrook Community Centre in Shepherds Drive to watch my daughter perform as an 'angel' in her school play. I remember this visit well because the Centre, then six years old, had excellent parking options for families, good facilities inside, the main hall roomy and the foyer large enough for parents to mingle.

I have crossed this Cherrybrook venue threshold many times since to attend various events. As a Hornsby Shire Councillor and Hornsby Council Art Group member, I decided to examine the Cherrybrook venue, without the crowds, to understand the scope of its facilities.

The sign at the front entrance of the building is facing Greenway Park and not visible to the public. Another sign is needed at the rear driveway to direct visitors to the entrance.

The children's playground is in urgent need of a renovation and modernisation of the equipment. The 'Junior Toilet' is a great facility but needs a blind on its windows for privacy.

The main hall and stage can accommodate 300 sitting and 420 standing. The kitchens and bathrooms are well equipped and my 'behind the scenes' tour indicates the venue has many multi-function rooms on offer.

The rear of the Community Centre overlooks the unleashed dog park. A dirt track between the dog park the car parking needs to be widened and paved. A proper distance should be allocated between the dog park and parking area so parked vehicles do not cover the footpath.

I have requested Hornsby Council staff to put in place my recommendations to ensure the Cherrybrook Community Centre continues to meet the future needs of residents.

Finally, in walking around the Cherrybrook Community Centre surrounds, I was



impressed with the new lighting on the pathway leading to the Cherrybrook shops. The exercise equipment near Greenway Park is a great example of what can be easily installed in other areas of Hornsby Shire.

### **MY FINAL VERDICT:**

The Cherrybrook community is very fortunate to have such great community facilities on their doorstep.


## HERE ARE SOME BASIC MAINTENANCE TIPS TO PREPARE YOUR PROPERTY:


- Clean your gutters of leaves and twigs
- Install metal gutter guards
- · Repair damaged or missing tiles on the roof
- Install fine metal mesh screens on windows and doors
- · Fit seals around doors and windows to eliminate gaps
- · Enclose the areas under the house
- · Repair or cover gaps in external walls
- Attach a fire sprinkler system to gutters
- · Keep lawns short and gardens well maintained
- · Cut back trees and shrubs overhanging buildings
- · Clean up fallen leaves, twigs, and debris around the property
- Have hoses long enough to reach around your house
- If you have a pool, tank, or dam, put a Static Water Supply (SWS) sign on your property entrance, so firefighters know where they can get water
- Check and maintain adequate levels of home and contents insurance. Ensure it is up to date


