I was recently reading an article in the paper about how as community we need to seriously look at how our society will be reshaped as our population ages.

Australians are getting older faster, as the baby boomers start reaching retirement age. Figures indicate that by 2026 over 22% of our population will have reached this age, which is up from 8.3% back in the 70's.

By 2050, a quarter of Australians will be over 65.

Our government spend is approx. \$10 billion a year on the aged care sector, with two-thirds of this on residential aged care.

The main issue for our elderly population is poor communication, lack of choice and control of their own decisions.

Under my guidance, Council initiated its successful 'Greening Our Shire' campaign, which saw 30,000 trees planted across the Shire, ensuring our bushland is preserved for future generations.

Hornsby Shire has a well-deserved reputation for sound financial management, a strength that has been built upon further during my term of Council. Indeed, during my tenure, my fellow Councillors and I have made tough decisions to ensure continued financial sustainability. I'm proud that Council's most recent Long Term Financial Plan puts it in good stead to maintain financial sustainability for the next 10 years.





Councils invite community to engage in future management of the Hawkesbury Nepean River

People who live, work or play along the Hawkesbury River are invited to share their thoughts on how it should be looked after as part the Hawkesbury Nepean River System Coastal Management Program (HNRS CMP), a project between six councils to establish a long-term plan for its coordinated management.

Led by Hornsby Shire Council and in partnership with Central Coast Council, Hawkesbury City Council, The Hills Shire Council, Ku-ring-gai Council and Northern Beaches Council and the NSW State Government, the HNRS CMP will include a 10-year program of works to improve waterway health, increase hazard resilience, and protect social and cultural values.

The community can learn more about the HNRS CMP and provide their feedback online or by visiting a drop-in session to have a chat with the project team and share their input.


In Hornsby Shire, the dates for the drop-in sessions are as follows:

- 26th September: 8am-4pm at Hornsby Organic Food Market, Hornsby Mall, Hornsby
- 29th September: 9am-1pm at Second Hand Hornsby Market, Jersey Lane, Hornsby
- 3rd October: 9am-2pm at Wisemans Ferry Boat Ramp, Old Northern Road, Wisemans Ferry
- 4th October: 9am-1pm at Parsley Bay Boat Ramp, 25 Karoola Street, Brooklyn
- 4th October: 2pm-5pm at The Cottage, 10 Dangar Road, Brooklyn
- 9th October: 12pm-5pm at Berowra Waters Marina, 199 Bay Road, Berowra Waters

Community members are welcome to drop by at any time during the sessions.

Once community consultation is complete on 24th November, the partner councils and state government agencies will review and consider the feedback. The councils will then prepare, exhibit and finalise the plan before submitting it to the NSW Government for certification and adoption.

Hornsby Shire Council General Manager Steven Head said the river means something different to everyone, so it's important as



many people as possible come forward with feedback.

"The Hawkesbury River plays a vital role in the lives of our community, supporting recreation, livelihoods and cultural significance, while also being a critical nature habitat. We encourage everyone to share their thoughts and help shape the future of our estuaries, lagoons and beaches to ensure their sustainability for future generations."
















Why Is Hearing in Noise So Difficult?

AN ARTICLE FROM THE TEAM AT EAR STUDIO

Many people struggle to follow conversations in noisy environments, such as family gatherings, BBQs, or meals at a busy pub. In these situations, conversations can seem "muddled up," making it difficult to communicate. But why is this, and what can be done to improve hearing in noisy settings?

The Challenge of Hearing in Noise

Struggling to hear in social settings can lead to tuning out, and in some cases, even social withdrawal. When there's a lot of background noise, it becomes harder to distinguish speech, and this challenge affects many people, not just those with hearing difficulties. The issue arises from how human speech is composed and how different sounds behave in noisy environments.

Speech consists of many different sounds. For example:

- Letters like "M," "N," "A," and "O" are low in frequency but have a lot
 of intensity and have lots of power, so they carry well as they have
 plenty of "energy".
- On the other hand, sounds like "TH," "S," "F," and "SH" are essentially
 only pressed air through the teeth and tongue. These unvoiced
 sounds are higher in frequency but have very little intensity. These
 sounds help provide clarity by distinguishing one word from another.

The difficulty is that these softer, high-frequency sounds are easily drowned out by louder noises. In a noisy social setting, as people raise their voices to compete with the surrounding noise, the louder, low-frequency sounds overpower the softer, high-frequency ones, making speech sound muffled. This effect is often called the "cocktail-party effect."

For people with age- or noise-related hearing loss, this situation is even more challenging because their ability to hear high-frequency sounds is already reduced.

The Impact On Social Life

For some people, even mild hearing loss can make social settings overwhelming. When conversations are hard to follow, it requires a lot of mental effort to keep up. Over time, this can be exhausting, leading some to avoid social gatherings altogether. The strain on the brain to make sense of the muffled sounds leads to fatigue and frustration. The good news is – that it doesn't have to be this way!

The Path to Better Hearing

Fortunately, there are ways to improve hearing in noisy environments. If you or someone you know struggles to hear in social settings,

here are some steps you can take (at Ear Studio we welcome your family member or significant other to any of your appointments):

1. Get a Professional Hearing Assessment

Get your hearing professionally assessed (not a quick 15min hearing check as you may find them in many shopping centres). At Ear Studio we conduct in-depth evaluations with measurements of many parameters like middle ear pressure, acoustic reflexes to assess some nerve functions, assessment of air and bone-conduction hearing as well as speech tests in quiet and in noise.

2. Discuss the Results

After your hearing assessment, your hearing care professional will discuss your results with you and prepare a written report for your GP. In some cases, medical conditions may need to be addressed before proceeding with hearing solutions.

3. Consider a Customised Hearing Rehabilitation Program

If a hearing loss is the reason for your difficulties, you can start your hearing rehabilitation through our Best Practice Fitting Program at Ear Studio. This involves a series of appointments throughout which you work closely with a hearing care professional. 

The next meeting of the Bromeliad Society of Australia will be held at the Federation Pavilion, Castle Hill Showground, Castle Hill on Saturday, 5th October with sales to the public from 10am and the meeting commencing at 12 noon.

The guest speaker will be one of our dedicated committee member's Bob Sharpley who will discuss his trials and tribulations of installing a suitable watering system for bromeliads.

After too many plants being damaged by the heat, because he wasn't home to water, he knew he needed to organise a watering system where his plants could water whenever he was away from home.

He researched watering systems and decided to go with a WiFi watering system which could be turned on or off as needed. He installed UV protected Nylex tubing with several different misting tips every metre. The system can be preset to turn on up to 12 times a day, or can be turn on manually. Since using this system he hasn't lost or had any damaged plant due to excessive heat.

There will be our usual 'Show, Tell and Ask' session and the very popular plant raffle.

Hidden In The Hills

Observing the Grey Fantail

Having a widespread distribution across most of Australia, the Grey Fantail is frequently observed feeding on flying insects, which it catches as it twists and turns in its agile aerial acrobatics, pursuing them from the edges of foliage trees at all levels above the ground.

Its nest is built in a thin tree-fork, around 2 to 5 metres from the ground, often quite exposed.

Made of fine grass, it is bound together with copious amounts of spiders web. The bottom of the nest under the thin branch is drawn down into a long stemlike shape, resembling a wine glass without the flat base.

Both parents share nest building, incubation of the eggs and feeding responsibilities of the young when they hatch. There can be up to three hatchlings in the nest for the parent birds to supply with food. They must keep up persistent activity to catch small insects required to meet the needs of their hungry offspring.

Grey Fantails are almost continually on the move, constantly changing position when perched, with the tail swishing back and forth while being fanned out. Despite their fluttering flight, they have been known to fly relatively long distances.

These small birds are easily recognised by their constantly open fan shaped tail when perched on a branch. Both male and female birds are similar in appearance:

grey above, a light grey underbody, with a thin white eyebrow, throat and tail edges. It is not unusual for this bird to fly in close proximity to human observers both in bushland and garden environments.


