

Rent out your vacant property to help homeless women

Do you own a home which is vacant?

The Hills Community Transitional Housing project is run by volunteers and is privately funded, networking with other agencies in the Hills and beyond. We are on the lookout for compassionate home-owners with vacant property who are willing to offer their property for rent, to accommodate homeless women.

Wesley Community Housing manages the tenancy agreements, and the benefits to the home-owners include:

- · Secure rent guarantee, no arrears to chase up.
- Property damage will be rectified guaranteed.
- No vacancy risk Wesley will still pay the rent even if the property is vacant for a while.
- Limited tenancy management follow up.
- Reduced inspection challenges.
- The opportunity to save lives during this homelessness pandemic and partner with a trusted housing community provider.

Helping homeless women

Seven years ago, two committed friends, one from Kenthurst Rotary and one from Annangrove RFS, became alarmed at the plight of women and children sleeping rough in the Hills and beyond.

They started a project called the Transitional Community Housing (The Hills) project.

Some 110,000 women aged over 45 in NSW are either homeless or in danger of becoming homeless. The fastest growing cohort of homeless people in Australia are women over 55, either due to domestic violence or they have no super to cover skyrocketing rents.


The Hills Shire is close to Penrith and Blacktown LGAs with reported DV cases, yet the homelessness minister's office tell us that there is no transitional, affordable or social housing available in this LGA.

There is a major problem with Women's Community Shelters turning away 30 women each week; Mary's House in North Sydney much the same and the CEO of Wesley Mission tells us that the homeless shelters are full.

Property Purchasing Cooling Off -**Inspection Reports**

When purchasing residential property during a Cooling Off period, it is always very important to obtain a building/pest inspection report. If you are purchasing a strata or townhouse, you also need to obtain a strata inspection report.

To obtain these reports is part of your own due diligence during cooling off. Nasty surprises that arise after settlement can cost you dearly.

For example, obtain a building and pest inspection report from a reputable inspector, to make sure the state and condition of the property is satisfactory during cooling off, to proceed smoothly to settlement. One client told me "She's right mate", didn't bother to obtain a building and pest inspection report, and it ended up costing him an additional \$35,000 after settlement because of a water leak problem.

Here's another example. For a townhouse or apartment, a strata inspection report from a reputable inspector is essential to


make sure the strata scheme is clear of any defects, major repairs, special levies or court/tribunal action.

One client told me "She's right mate", didn't bother to get a strata inspection report, and after settlement it cost her an additional \$14,000 in strata special levies, because she was not privy to the building remediation works.

Both examples above were painful experiences to both clients, for not ordering and obtain inspection reports, during cooling off. Be smart when buying and do your own due diligence.



Max Mannix is an Australian artist who paints stories or 'yarns', based on his years growing up in Victorian country towns and working on




cattle stations in the Queensland outback.





Hidden In The Hills

Prickly Moses

Several of the wattle family have an extended flowering period commencing in mid autumn through to near the end of spring. One such plant is Prickly Moses (Acacia ulicifolia), which, as its name implies, has rigid narrow "leaves" with a sharp spike at the end.

It has been observed that the spiky nature of the foliage allows small birds a measure of protection from larger aggressive birds that have a tendency to attack them.

This variety of Acacia, mainly flowering from June to September, is often overlooked due to its small inconspicuous flowers found at the end of a short stalk spaced intermittently along the stiff branchlets. The new flower bud appears as a cluster of small yellow balls collected together in a spherical shape at the end of the stalk, this spherical shape being about 5 - 10 mm across.

The small balls open out to create the fluffy cream flower as seen in the adjacent images. They can be up to 15 mm across.

When the flowers mature they slowly turn a somewhat unattractive brown colour before dropping off the branchlets.



Another reason why this wattle is often overlooked is due to its low straggly, untidy habit. At times there can be more spent flowers visible than there are new ones. It is not usual for this wattle to grow more than about 1 metre tall and around 1 metre wide.

It can be cultivated in the form of a low hedge being readily propagated by normal seed raising methods and pruned to a more compact shape.

A similar species flowering a couple of months later is the Golden Prickly Wattle (Acacia brownii). This variety has flowers that are a much richer yellow colour than Prickly Moses.









Dural Rainfall Charts
