



# Local representatives jointly call for New Line Road upgrade

Local MPs today have called on the Minns-Labor Government to honour the previous Coalition Government's commitment to upgrading New Line Road.

\$70 million is required to convert New Line Road to dual carriageway between Purchase Road and Hastings Road. However, the Minns-Labor Government have yet to support this planned upgrade.

Today, various representatives, at all three levels of government, have come together to jointly call on the NSW government to upgrade New Line Road.

- The State MP for Hornsby, Matt Kean said, "This upgrade is vital to relieve congestion on New Line Road to improve safety and travel times. Chris Minns needs to stop playing politics and start delivering the required essential infrastructure."
- Julian Leeser, Federal Member for Berowra said,
  "People throughout the Berowra electorate have been calling for
  the upgrade of New Line Road since before I was elected. I was
  proud to deliver Federal funding to support the State Government
  in planning the upgrade of the road. By delaying this crucial project
  indefinitely, the Minns-Labor Government is letting down everyone
  who has fought for this project for almost 2 decades."
- "The NSW Government must deliver essential infrastructure, not just pump more residents in an area where people are already forced to use a road that is at its capacity," said Mark Hodges, State MP for Castle Hill.
- Robyn Preston, State MP for Hawkesbury made the point, "New Line Road might be located in the electorate of Hornsby

however, due to its strategically important location and key links, the flow of this road seriously impacts residents of Hawkesbury daily. The desperate need for its immediate upgrade cannot be ignored by the Minns-Labor Government."

- "Independent reports have identified an upgrade to New Line Road would improve safety, traffic flow, travel times and provide capacity for the growing population of Sydney's northwest, as well as support the NSW Government's Cherrybrook (Metro) Priority Precinct," said, Hornsby Mayor Philip Ruddock.
- Peter Gangemi, Hills Shire Mayor said, "The upgrade of New Line Road is a critical project to help people get to and from the rural suburbs in The Hills. As more families choose to call The Hills home, it is important that the State Government remain committed to key infrastructure projects such as the upgrade of New Line Road".
- Nathan Tilbury, Hornsby Shire Council Deputy Mayor said,
   "Despite the desperate need, the new NSW Labor Government
   have yet to commit to upgrading New Line Road to make it fit for
   purpose for the existing population. They cannot only consider
   new developments in the area without also considering the
   required infrastructure."

# **Commercial Leasing & Business Premises**

Most business owner-operators rent their business premises (commercial office, shop, or industrial property) from a landlord, paying rent, GST, outgoings and with tenant rights / obligations.

Important to engage the right solicitor to review the commercial lease document, before signing and exchanging. To make sure terms, conditions, your tenant rights, and obligations are in order. Two main considerations to look out for, your permitted use, and your business risks. Permitted use - make sure you do your own homework and research, to make sure your business operations are a permitted use, both with any council DA (Development Applications) requirements, if needed and if in a strata property, for any strata by laws requirements/restrictions. For example, an industrial strata warehouse complex might have restrictions on chemical manufacturing or storage.

Business risks - the commercial lease document from the landlord's solicitor, could have tenant obligations, that could include risks involving strata related contractor trades people entering into the business premises. Make sure your solicitor reviews such clauses, ask for amendments if needed, and get your business insurance broker involved, to make sure you are covered for such risks, in case such risks do occur.

I love living in The Hills. With a 2-year-old son who never runs out of energy and by all accounts seems to be solar powered, it's amazing to have so many playgrounds walking distance from our home. # **News from History Cottage**

How fortunate is our community to have a person with intimate knowledge of the history of the establishment of the war memorial at Hell Fire Pass. While working in Thailand, Ken Bradley, our guest speaker for April, was able to draw together much valuable information on locations, personal recollections and rare photographs associated with the construction of the railway during World War Two. Ken hopes to present these valuable resources to the Australian War Memorial.

Our guest speaker on 11th May will be Judith Dunn OAM. Judith is a widely respected author, historian and guide; she is also a most entertaining speaker. She will tell the stories of some of the 25,000 convict women transported to the colonies between 1788 and 1868. Their crimes, how they lived, and overcame the many obstacles they met, make for an interesting afternoon. The Government facilities, such of the Female Factory and the Orphanage, played an important role for many, and our tour in May to Parramatta will visit these. It is worthwhile reading "The Floating Brothel" by Sian Rees, the story of the convict transport ship Lady Julian bringing



237 women to the Colony in 1789. The humanity and pragmatism shown is a message to those who might think only the worst.

This ANZAC day dawn service was held at the Cenotaph commencing at 6.30. As usual the Society provided seating and facilities

# Castle Hill History: Our Exiles

The Castle Hill Heritage Park is a gem. Even more so now that it has steel beams giving the precise location and dimensions of the former two storey barracks for convicts.

The construction was directed by Governor King. He showed concern for convicts in other ways. One person freed by Governor King was Father James Dixon, convicted [seemingly in error] of Sedition. He was appointed as Chaplain to the Colony's Catholic community. On 15th of May 1803, he celebrated the first public Catholic Mass in the Colony in what is now the Heritage Park.

The Mass was attended by Governor King and most of the Colony's dignitaries.

The two leaders of the Castle Hill Rebellion of 1804, William Johnston and the stonemason Philip Cunningham, were United Irishmen who had taken part in the first Battle of Vinegar Hill in 1788, aimed at freeing Ireland from English rule. Johnson and Cunningham still wished to fight for Irish independence; their defeat here was given the same name as the first one - Vinegar Hill. Johnston and Cunningham were taken prisoner at musket point under a flag of truce. Cunningham was then cut down by a sword wielded by Quartermaster Laycock.

In the Castle Hill Rebellion, Father Dixon was used by Major Johnson in order to delay the Rebels. After the Rebellion was guashed,

he was dismissed from his post as Catholic Chaplain and then removed from the Colony. Major Johnson received a land grant. Ironically, he was to later depose a Governor.

## **Councillor Mitchell Blue**

Council currently has a number of plans and surveys on exhibition.

The Hills Shire Plan is Council's annual plan, setting out its delivery, operational and resourcing strategy for the next twelve months.

### The plan's budget is split into 5 pillars:

- 1. Building a vibrant community and prosperous economy \$54.4 million
- 2. Proactive Leadership \$10.3 million
- 3. Shaping growth \$12.3 million
- 4. Delivering and maintaining infrastructure \$162.8 million
- 5. Valuing our surroundings \$68.7 million

Total expenditure (including depreciation) of \$338.1 million.

Some key projects include \$24.4 million for the Annangrove Rd upgrade from Edwards Road to Windsor Rd, \$20.2 million for the Withers Rd upgrade from Smalls Creek to Barry Rd, \$17.6 million for the upgrade of Boundary Rd, along with a number of parks, environmental initiatives for our waterways.

One such environmental initiative is to further investigate the possibility of water quality testing of our creeks and tributaries. I was pleased to bring this to the table at a recent strategic workshop with a briefing to Councillors to come shortly.

I encourage residents to view this plan which is on Council's website, and provide comment.

### Council also has two surveys out for residents to participate in.

- 1. Arts and Culture Strategy
- 2. Housing and Infrastructure

I encourage you to have your say by visiting the 'have your say' page on Council's website. Your input via will help guide council as it moves forward.

I am a big supporter of community engagement and after having called for a review of Council's community engagement strategy in 2022, I am glad to see the newly adopted strategy put into practice.

# "Posting & boasting" break-in could happen in your home

As Ward C Hornsby Shire Councillor, I attend the bi-annual Community Safety Precinct Committee Meetings, hosted by Ryde Police Area Command (RPAC), and accompanied by Mayor Philip Ruddock. These meetings provide updates on emerging crimes, community safety and crime statistics.



In 2023, we were advised young offenders were breaking into homes in our area, stealing car keys, taking vehicles on a 'joyride', posting Instagram images of the high speeds of the vehicles stolen and then selling, dumping or burning the vehicle.

Shortly after this meeting, a local resident woke to discover his new

4WD had been stolen. On examining camera footage around his home, he saw six men, dressed in black with balaclavas, scaling walls around his home during the night. One man entered the home by squeezing through a small dog door in the laundry. Our resident was horrified to see all the men then enter and walk around the house whilst his family slept. He saw his car keys being picked up from the kitchen bench, his laptop and watch being taken, and his car driven away. He immediately contacted the Police, his car was fortunately tracked and recovered but items taken from the home were never located.

The media refer to this type of crime as 'posting and boasting.' Police suggest we must maintain responsible trust to ensure our safety in the home, the safety of our possessions and security of our vehicles. We must ensure all windows and doors are locked at night. If possible, keep vehicles locked in the garage and car keys should always be under your mattress when you go to bed - never leave car keys on the kitchen bench!

For many years, it has been a key priority of mine to champion a better deal for our area from the telcos – for more towers and fewer blackspots.

Only weeks ago, we got a new phone tower in Glenhaven. This is a cause of celebration after years fighting for the tower.

I agree with the Minister for Communications Michelle Rowland that reliable communications is not "a nice to have, it's a necessity".

It has become apparent to me that the Government's decision to shut down the 3G network has not been totally thought through. It's also a deep concern to local residents.

Residents have told me in emails: "Lately my signal bars have reduced to one bar and I appear to only have 3G".

And "We don't rely on 3G unless 4G is down, which happens. We seem to be in a black spot or hole. We need 3G when this happens."

Another resident wrote, "4G is very bad at our address. We needed to install a phone booster. The phone booster works better on 3G than 4G.

Many residents across the electorate are still relying on the 3G network and cannot get the 4G or 5G network. And for those in boats on the Hawkesbury River, 3G is the vital link with emergency services.

There is not a shortage of technology, only a shortage of will.

It's a cause I took up during the recent parliamentary sitting fortnight. I am pleased that Minister Rowland has formed a working group inquiring into the 3G shutdown - with a particular emphasis on triple zero calls.

Additionally, following my advocacy and the advocacy of others in the Coalition, the shutdown of the 3G network has been referred to the Senate's Rural and Regional Affairs and Transport References Committee, to review the impact that the shutdown will have on Australians who rely on the 3G network.

# **Eastern Water** Dragon

Beneath bushland and tree ferns along watercourses can be found creatures that thrive in the wet conditions.

On exposed rocks or logs near water, it is possible to see an Eastern Water Dragon

(Physignathus lesueurii), soaking up the warmth of the sunshine. Their strong and sharp claws allow them to climb rockfaces or trees.

Although guite large, growing to about 80cm long, they are difficult to locate. When disturbed they scurry into crevices or deep water, and may remain submerged for up to 30 minutes.

Their diet can be other smaller reptiles, earth worms, frogs and insects, as well as fallen ripe berries.

Mature dragons may exhibit black and red markings on their body. Females lay around 12 eggs in an excavated hole in sandy soil above the floodline and eggs hatch in about three months. # Hidden In The Hills Platypus research at St. Albans field day

Setting out from Dural and meeting up at St. Albans, Hawkesbury Nepean Landcare Network coordinator, Monique Bailey, organised a field trip and workshop to investigate threatened species in the region.

Our group met at the Pickled Wombat on Bulga Rd, after crossing the truss steel bridge over the Macdonald River.

We sat down for a community workshop on the need for a wildlife survey in the Macdonald River valley. Our first speaker, Dr. Michelle Ryan from Western Sydney University, spoke of her Platypus research and previous catch and release program that checked on the health of the population in their urban home range.

Our second speaker was Stephan from the NSW Biodiversity Conservation Trust who spoke of the known local threatened species, including plants as well as animals. All were subject to the same problem of isolated home ranges with no connectivity to others, creating genetically similar groups which are vulnerable to becoming locally extinct.

We heard about the importance of online reporting tools, community engagement, citizen science, research projects and surveys to ensure all species are fully represented, which aids in the conservation of endangered flora and fauna.


