



DRIVER DIES AFTER KENTHURST CRASH

A man has died after being critically injured in a single-vehicle crash at Kenthurst last week. Emergency services had been called to Kenthurst Road about 10.30pm last Friday (15th November 2024), after a blue Ford XR6 Falcon sedan left the roadway and hit a power pole.

The 18-year-old driver suffered multiple injuries and was taken to Westmead Hospital in a critical condition.

The front-seat passenger, a 19-year-old man, suffered a head injury, while the back-seat passenger, also aged 18, escaped with minor injuries.

Officers attached to The Hills Police Area Command initiated inquiries, assisted by the Crash Investigation Unit (CIU).

Police have now been advised the driver died yesterday in hospital.

The older man remains in hospital in a stable condition, while the third man was released. All three are from Glenwood.

A report will be prepared for the information of the Coroner.

Information is treated in strict confidence. The public is reminded not to report information via NSW Police social media pages.

Engineering. His research and knowledge, together with many old photographs, recalled earlier days for many. Who can forget those mighty trains of the steam era. The distinctive smell of the sheep and cattle vans coming down from the country, the sturdy coal bins from the Hunter and Illawarra, the luxury of the sleeper trains, and the coal dust in the eyes when someone forgot to close the window approaching the tunnels. David's talk showed how much more he had to offer and he has kindly offered to come again next year; one the Society is most happy to accept.

Another part of David's talk covered the building operations. Our district has a number of the Hudson Ready Cut homes which form part of its architectural heritage. Sandra and Ken Gregory are the custodians of one such buildings and they brought along a painting to show (see photo).

In his report to members, the President drew attention to the fact that our audience comprised people who were members of a so many different organisations. The common thread was a dedication and concern for our community in so many ways; garden clubs, volunteer fire brigades, progress associations, bush regenerations, church associations, to name but some.

from the **Mayor's Desk**

As a longtime resident of the area, I am incredibly proud of Hornsby Shire's unique mixture of urban towns and rural villages. While serving as a Councillor I maintained a commitment to ensuring our public spaces are safe, functional and attractive. So, I'm incredibly disappointed when I see our public spaces defaced by graffiti, a sentiment that I know is shared by much of our community.

I am keen to tackle this growing problem, so I have asked Council to prepare a report outlining options for a Shire wide strategy, with a strong focus on community involvement in preventing unwanted graffiti and its removal from private property.

I have been impressed at just how efficient Council's own team are at dealing with graffiti on Council owned assets. The problem however is much greater than this and will require collaboration with the community, private property owners, and the NSW Government. I look forward to sharing more information about this important issue in the coming months.

The revitalisation project at Galston Village is another example of how Council is upgrading our village centres to make them places people want to meet and gather. Following the exhibition of the Galston Village Public Domain Plan, refinements have been made based on community feedback. The next steps are to develop a detailed design and tender for construction. The proposed improvements are expected to commence in mid-2025, subject to final design approval by TfNSW, (former RMS).

As the year draws to a close, we look forward to some down time in order to celebrate and enjoy time spent in our beautiful Bushland Shire. From paddling in our waterways, to enjoying our parks and playgrounds, there is so much to experience right here on our doorstep.

I hope you, like me, will enjoy spending time with family and friends. I wish you all a cheerful and joyful holiday season and a prosperous new year.



The Hawkesbury River is a jewel in the crown here in The Hills.

So, it is important that we continue to ensure the river quality is at its best. Many of the creeks and tributaries here in The Hills flow into the Hawkesbury so what you do at your home, may have an impact further down the river. It is one of my priorities to implement regular water quality testing of our creeks and tributaries. It has been great to talk to river users, whether they be commercial fishers or boating groups. These groups are a great source of knowledge and information.

With that in mind, I am glad to see the progression of the Hawkesbury Nepean River System Coastal Management Program. In August 2018, Council entered a Memorandum of Understanding with the Hawkesbury Nepean River System Coastal Management Program and has partnered with five other councils to deliver this. The HNCMP is currently at stage 3 of 5, which is to prepare, exhibit, finalise, certify and adopt. This stage requires Community consultation. The HNCMP is in the community consultation period, where a long list of actions are publicised for comment, as well as being open to suggestions from the community. This is done over 10 weeks and concludes 24/11/2024. There is an online map based portal that is open to the public to gather feedback. I encourage those interested to have a look. More information can be found on Council's Have Your Say website.

Over the past few weeks since being elected, I have been spending a lot of time getting around to the many different local organizations across the Hornsby electorate, as I get acquainted with the community and gain a better understanding for the issues and challenges facing our residents.

Recently I had a meeting with Superintendent Dan Meijer, the Acting District Manager for Hornsby Ku-ring-gai Rural Fire Service, at their recently upgraded Headquarters at Cowan.

With 19 brigades, 65 vehicles (including 6 boats) and a total of 1,318 volunteers, the Hornsby Ku-ring-gai RFS District is the Hornsby Electorate's largest volunteer organization. The District volunteers are supported by 12 professional staff.

This calendar year, the organisation has responded to 557 fire calls, trained an additional 498 volunteers and held 56 training courses for the existing members. They have also undertaken 14 hazard reduction burns of around 225 hectares.

I was very impressed to go through the details of what Dan and his team have done to prepare for the 2024/25 bushfire season.

However, please do not solely rely on the RFS to save you and your property in the event of a nearby dangerous bushfire.



Every resident should be "bushfire ready" and every property should be prepared for the bushfire season.

Well done to the organisers including Nicola MacGee, Ruth Swadling and Karen Humphries for a successful event. It was a privilege to walk with them as part of the Survivors and Carers Walk, along with my mother who recently battled cancer.

I recently visited a fantastic organisation in our area, and I'd like to share a little bit about them.

Warrah Disability Services is located in Dural, and it is a fantastic not-for-profit service which is dedicated to performing particular services for people with disability. Importantly, Warrah is providing opportunities for people where they may not previously have had the chance to participate fully as a member of our community.

Their work began back in the sixties, with Warrah operating as a special school by day and a group home by night, but times have changed.

Nowadays, Warrah offers supported independent living for adults across 13 homes with 24/7 care, community support services and in-home support. Along with that, Warrah is the only Steiner specialist school operating in Australia, providing K to12 education with 31 students currently enrolled. Warrah also operates a biodynamic farm and operates an organic farm shop which I had the chance to learn more about on my visit. More recently, Warrah has assisted with the creation of microenterprises, including candles made by Rohan, who is a regular participator at the Dural

Men's Shed. Ben and Jim have also started mowing lawns with the assistance of the team at Warrah.

When I visited Warrah recently, I caught up with the CEO Delia Gray, school principal Anna Wetzel, farm manager Steve Tennikoff and property manager David Sharkie and I really learned a lot so I'm grateful for the time they spent talking with me. I also met students, Talara, Harry, Max and Jasmin and saw the positive impact that Warrah's programs are having.

Along with the staff, we talked about the organisation's history, the fantastic work that Warrah is doing right now and about their plans for the future which will provide even more opportunities for people living with a disability, but also involve more members of our broader community outside of Warrah's participants and students. The way they want to achieve this is by developing a small farm animal management practice which would be open to the public while teaching participants about animal husbandry and have a positive impact on our environment – I think it sounds great and already know my children would love the chance to visit.

I'm excited about Warrah's plans to expand, open new learning opportunities and bring our community along the journey. Right now, I'm working on a plan to support them as they grow and continue to support people in our community to lead an engaging and fulfilling life and I know our community will be backing them too.

Rising Costs, Struggling Families: Why the Government Must Act Now

Under the current Government, essential costs have surged: food prices are up 5.8%, housing costs by 7.4%, and health premiums by 5.1%. In NSW, school canteen prices have risen by up to 50% with over 500 public school canteens now operated by private contractors-despite the Government's stated opposition to privatisation.



Small businesses are also feeling the pressure, with 82% reporting increased time and money spent on compliance.

The Opposition has called for the reinstatement of cost-of-living measures like Active Kids and

Creative Kids vouchers to ease financial strain on families.

Communities are increasingly dissatisfied, and the Opposition urges the Government to listen and take meaningful action to support struggling households.

As these issues continue to affect communities across New South Wales, it's crucial that the government listens to the real-life concerns of its citizens and takes meaningful action.

I encourage anyone affected by these pressures, or who has ideas or suggestions, to reach out to my office. Your feedback is invaluable in shaping policies that matter to our community. I am always available to listen, discuss concerns, and work together to find solutions.

Together, we can push for the change our communities urgently need.

Hidden In The Hills

Bushcare

BY LACHLAN TURNER

As you drive along roads that border our bushland reserves, frequently there are signs displayed stating "Bush Regeneration in Progress", or, "Bushcare This Sunday".

If the integrity of our natural bushland scene is to be maintained, and native plants are to be protected, it is necessary from time to time for some form of remediation work to be carried out.

Much of this work is carried out by dedicated bush care workers, many of whom live nearby to the reserve in which they work, in a voluntary capacity.

This important and valuable activity is mainly brought about because of exotic and introduced plants, including shrubs, garden plants and grasses invading the borders of the natural bush areas, stifling the more delicate native vegetation.

Many other garden plants that have abundant seed production can now be found growing along the banks of bushland creeks having been washed there with storm water after heavy rain.

Along these creek lines there can be found infestations of blackberry, lantana and privet that have colonised this favourable



moisture laden habitat. Such woody weeds are extremely difficult to remove and require the persistent efforts of volunteer bush carers.

Experienced bush care workers can be found on a regular basis doing their bit to save and protect our native species from extinction.

Also as you walk along sections of bushland tracks, bushcare work can be obvious. However, where tracks pass nearby to residential properties, there may be evidence of garden refuse and other rubbish that has been dumped into the bushland fringes. It is a shame that the devastating impact of this kind of behaviour continues to occur.









Dural Rainfall Charts




